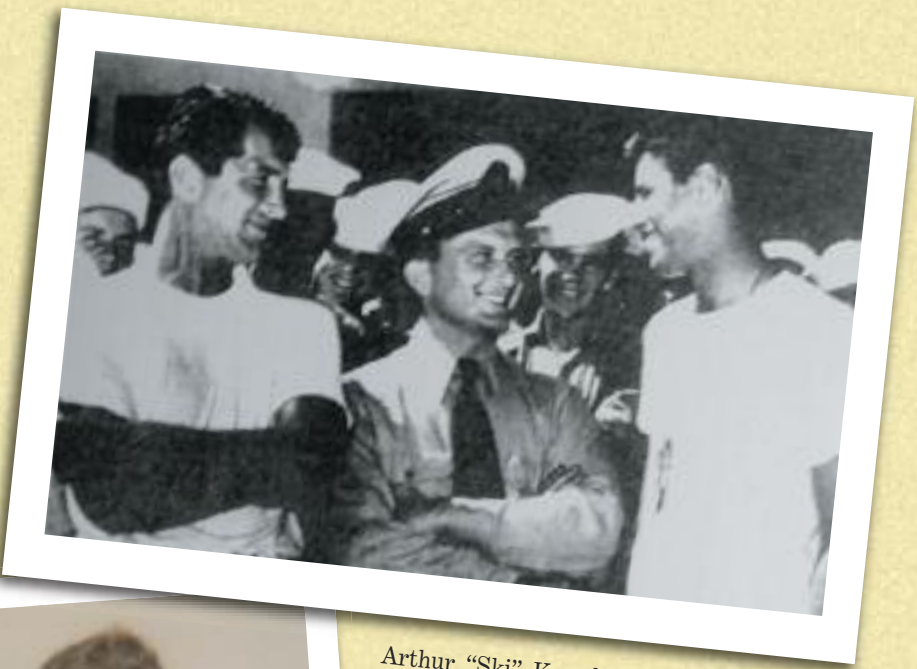

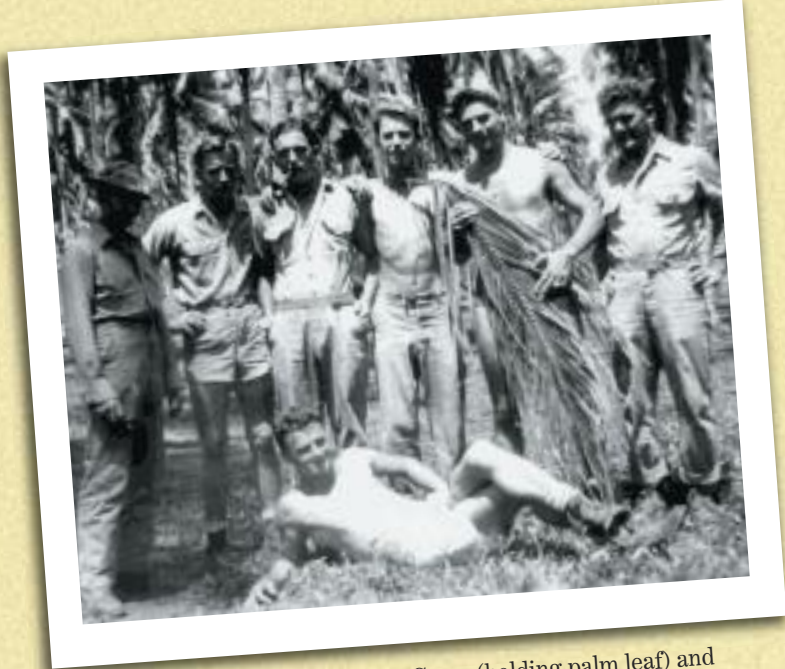
John J. Lovas served both as a shipboard Marine and in a Marine defense battalion attached to the 1st Division.
